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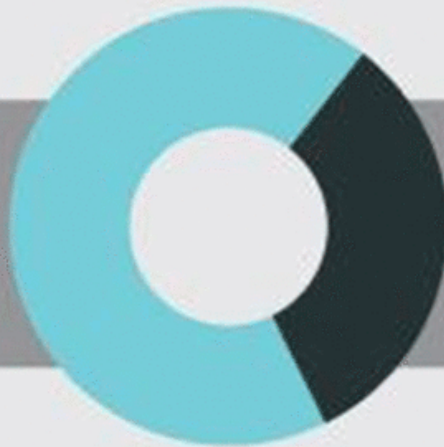

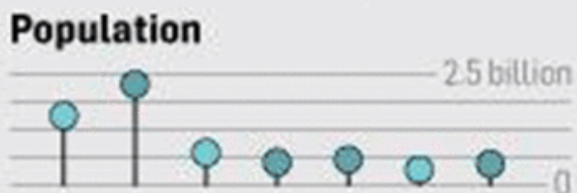
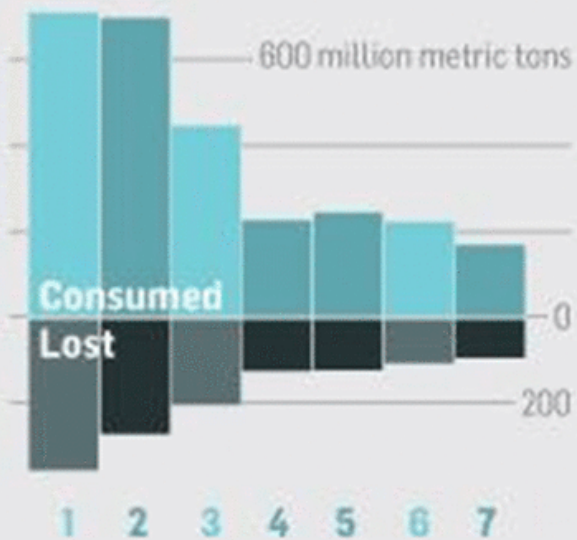

BIGGEST LOSERS

In total, developing regions waste as much food as industrialized ones. Asia—home to half the world's population—loses the most overall.
